The Louvre in Paris, France is the world's largest museum and home to one of the most impressive art collections in history. The museum is so large that it would take 100 days to see all the artworks.

The history of the museum dates back to 12th century. The name of this famous museum "Louvre" is uncertain, but one theory suggests it may come from the Latin word "lupus", the wolf which refers to a time when wolves and forests were common in the area.

The Louvre was initially built as a fortress, later became a royal palace, and was officially opened as a public museum after the French Revolution in 18th century. Parts of the original fortress are still visible in the museum's basement. The museum was always under protection.

During World War II, the Louvre's most valuable pieces were secretly moved to avoid being destroyed by the Nazis. The tall glass metal pyramid in front of the museum is quite modern. It was designed by Chinese-American artist and is used as the main entrance today. Over half of the paintings in the Louvre are by French artists, and a quarter of all Leonardo da Vinci's paintings are there. The museum still hosts millions of visitors every year.

Around the world, students live in many different kinds of dormitories, but one of the most interesting is the Tietgen Dormitory in Copenhagen, Denmark. This building opened in 2006 and is famous for its unique round design. From above, it looks like a perfect circle, inspired by traditional Chinese communal houses called "tulou".

Its round form symbolizes equality and unity. It is designed to connect students with each other and nature. The modern architecture, natural light, and eco-friendly materials make the building not only beautiful but also sustainable.

The center of the building is a large open courtyard, which is used for sports, concerts, and community events. It is the heart of the dormitory and a place where people can relax in the fresh air.

The dormitory has space for about 400 students. Each student has a private room with a bathroom, internet, and often a small balcony. However, students also share kitchens, laundry rooms, and lounges. This makes daily life social and friendly.
